Terms of Reference

Niagara Infant Mental Health Pilot Advisory Committee is the planning body for piloting the ASQ:SE and ASQ:3 and the developmental support plan providing recommendations and linkages to the early learning and child care community in Niagara.

Purpose

To pilot the use of the ASQ:3 and ASQ:SE and the developmental support plan with early learning and child care programs across Niagara to determine effectiveness and value.

Roles of the Advisory Committee

- Provide advisement for the direction of the pilot program and support sites as needed.
- Should the pilot be successful, help mobilize the use of the tools across Niagara.
- Participate in communicating the pilot outcomes to the larger early learning and child care community.
- Supporting the pilot sites with the development of goals and strategies.
- Continue as a supportive network beyond the pilot to offer a collaborative approach to supporting families in need
- Building capacity and expertise for supporting mental health issues.

Decision Making

In most cases, decisions are made by consensus of the committee; however, when no consensus can be reached a formal vote will take place with quorum determining the outcome.

Accountability

Attendance at meetings and providing ongoing advisement for the duration of the project.

Confidentiality

Members have an ethical responsibility to maintain confidentiality should conversations regarding specific families and/or programs be discussed.
